HEY MONTGOMERY!

Let's keep it out of the gutter.

Storm drains collect storm water runoff from homes, businesses, parking lots, and streets and discharge it directly to a nearby waterway. Two major waterways in Montgomery are the Alabama River and Catoma Creek.

Many people are unaware that everything that washes down a storm drain winds up in local lakes, rivers, or streams without being treated at a wastewater treatment facility.

Leaves, grass clippings, and yard debris can plug pipes causing flooding, degrade and become septic (smells bad) and ruins the water for aquatic organisms. The water smells like sewage.

These same waters not only are potential sources for drinking water but also afford you opportunities to fish, swim and enjoy other water recreational activities.
