Montgomery Bus Boycott Historic Civil Rights Trail  
A Proposal

The Montgomery Bus Boycott and the Selma to Montgomery March were two of the greatest mass movements in American history. While Montgomery has a trail to mark the historic march of 1965, the city can benefit greatly by creating similar recognition for the earlier bus boycott.

The two-part proposed Montgomery Bus Boycott Historic Civil Rights Trail will focus on the period from December 5, 1955, with the trial of seamstress Rosa L. Parks, to December 20, 1956, when *Browder v. Gayle* took effect.

The proposed trail will highlight people and places associated with the success of the bus boycott to enhance tourists' understanding and appreciation for their public utterances and their private deeds.

Embracing two geographical areas, the Montgomery Bus Boycott Historic Civil Rights Trail–West will begin at the intersection of Holt and Stone Streets and end in the 1200 block on now-Rosa L. Parks Avenue. It will also include Clinton and Columbia Streets and several blocks along then-West Jeff Davis Avenue.

The Montgomery Bus Boycott Historic Civil Rights Trail–East will commence at Jackson and Key Streets and conclude in the 900 block of South Jackson Street. It will also include High Street, Highland Avenue, and Grove, Dericote, Bolivar, Shephard, and Union Streets.
