ORDINANCE NO. 20-2016

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3, SECTION 8, AND SECTION 13 OF ORDINANCE 5-2013 WHICH GRANTED A FRANCHISE TO SOUTHERN LIGHT, LLC, ITS SUCCESSORS OR ASSIGNS, TO LAY, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE A FIBER OPTIC TRANSMISSION CABLE FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF TELEPHONIC DATA AND OTHER ELECTRONIC MESSAGES IN, ON, UNDER AND/OR ACROSS PUBLIC PLACES OR WAYS AND PRESCRIBING CONDITIONS AND LIMITATIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTGOMERY, ALABAMA, that Section 3, Section 8 and Section 13 of Ordinance 5-2013 granting a franchise to Southern Light, LLC be amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Franchise Term and Limitations

The right, privilege and franchise is hereby granted to Grantee, its successors and assigns, for an initial term of fifteen (15) years from February 4, 2013, effective upon the date of final enactment and publication of this Ordinance, as provided by law and the acceptance by the Grantee as provided in Section 10, to lay, construct, install, maintain, lease and/or operate a fiber optic transmission cable, and all appurtenances and appendages thereto, for the transmission of telephonic data and other electronic messages in, under, along and/or across the City rights-of-way, together with the right to make, install, maintain, repair and replace all such cable and usual equipment or apparatus as may be reasonably necessary or desirable in the operation of said fiber optics communications transmission system, provided the locations and manner or mode of installing or replacing any and all such cable, equipment or apparatus shall be approved in advance by the City. The right to use and occupy said streets, alleys, public ways and places for the purposes set forth shall not be exclusive, and the City reserves the right to grant a similar use of said streets, alleys, public ways and places to any person at any time during the period of this franchise. The grant of this franchise is for the use by Grantee for the purpose of providing telecommunications and other services and facilities as may be authorized by appropriate federal or state regulatory agencies. This franchise may be extended beyond such initial term upon application to the City in accordance with applicable federal, state and/or local laws. Grantee shall file with the City Engineer or plats of all installations and the types of equipment and facilities installed or constructed, properly identified and described as to the type of equipment and facility by appropriate symbols and marks and which shall include annotations of all public ways, streets and roads where the work is to be undertaken. Maps shall be drawn in a scale which shall allow proper review and interpretation and will be filed no less than ten (10) working days before any installation of said cable or equipment or facilities. If, at any time during the period of this franchise, the City shall lawfully elect to vacate, relocate, abandon, alter, reconstruct or change the grade of any street, sidewalk, alley or other public way to include drainage and utility areas, Grantee, upon reasonable notice by the City, shall remove, relay and relocate its pole, wires, cables, underground conduits, manholes and other fixtures at its own expense. Should Grantee refuse or fail to remove its equipment or plant as provided for herein within forty-five (45) days after written notification, unless the parties

agree in writing to an extension of time, the City of Montgomery shall have the right to do

such work or cause it to be done, free of any liability to Grantee for damage done to its

equipment and plant in the course of such work, and the full cost thereof shall be

chargeable to Grantee. Additionally, the Grantee shall join and participate in the

Montgomery Internet Exchange.

Section 8. Public Use Pathways.

Grantee hereby agrees to unrestricted use by the City for non-commercial public

purposes only at no cost to the City two (2) fiber strands along the entire backbone of its

fiber optic system, both underground and aerial (hereinafter called the "Public Use

Pathway"). The Public Use Pathway, when determined to be installed in a manner which

will permit unrestricted use by the City, shall be accepted by the City. The City shall be

allowed use of the Public Use Pathway, at no cost to the City, for non-commercial, public

purposes only except that the City shall be responsible for the cost and expense of any

damages and liabilities caused by the willful or wanton acts of the City, its employees, or

any other person under the direction and/or control of the City resulting from City's use of

or access to the Public Use Pathway.


